Dear readers,

We decided to develop sustainable products many years ago. We started with our first GOTS certified organic cotton bed linen. But shortly after we introduced „Breeze“ - the name of the collection at the time - we realised that this could only be the beginning of the journey towards responsible textile production. In 2011, we promptly obtained additional Fairtrade certification and decided to buy our cotton directly from the small-holder farmers of the ChetnaOrganics cooperative in India.

In the meantime, our sustainable fibre range has grown to a considerable size and includes recycled polyester, TENCEL™, TENCEL™ x REFIBRA™ or Cotton made in Africa, further ecologically and socially compatible alternatives to conventional cotton and polyester.

We have also transferred the transparency in the value chain to our conventional ranges. We are therefore steadily increasing the use of Cotton made in Africa cotton.

In addition, we encourage our suppliers to be certified according to the Sustainable Textile Production Standard (STeP) and the EU Ecolabel. These ensure environmentally friendly manufacturing processes, socially acceptable working conditions, the use of safe chemicals in the production process and sound wastewater management. This can be seen on the Oekotex Made in Green label on almost all Dibella products or optionally the EU Eco Flower. With our new supply chain video we

prove it and take you on an exciting journey through a complex GOTS/Fairtrade production chain.

My responsibilities as a buyer at Dibella include regular visits to our suppliers and my own internal audits of the production sites. I am surrounded by a team of great and highly competent people, from clerks to textile engineers and quality managers, who support me, have my back. But they also criticise me directly when I overshoot the mark. By far the most exciting current development is the new Supply Chain Liability Act of the German government and the EU. It stipulates direct liability for companies with 3,000 or more employees and, from 2024, even 1,000 or more employees for the purchase of questionable products, including textiles. Many companies in the EU are not yet aware of this! It is good that Dibella, as a pioneer, already fulfils all the legal requirements for the entire product range or even exceeds them in some cases, I can announce that with some pride!

As you can see - Dibella takes its corporate and social responsibility seriously, as a great challenge that can also be fun! In the current issue you can read about the tasks we are currently concentrating on. I hope you enjoy it.

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
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
